

Senior Church Members (at least 70 $\frac{1}{2}$ years old) can reduce their tax burden by donating to the church and favorite charitable organizations through their IRA accounts.

If you are 70 $\frac{1}{2}$ years old or older the Internal Revenue Service requires you to receive REQUIRED MINIMUM DISTRIBUTIONS (RMD) each year from your IRA accounts. These distributions are taxable when withdrawn by the taxpayer. You can make these distributions nontaxable by having your financial institution pay your charitable contributions (including donations to your church) directly to qualified charitable organizations. Non-profits that are eligible to receive tax-deductible contributions are considered qualified. Bethel is

an organization qualified to receive such contributions and is happy to receive your qualified charitable distribution (QCD) from your IRA.

Bethel will provide you with an acknowledgement of the contribution and your financial institution will report the non-taxable QCD to the IRS on Form 1099-R.

Making your contribution to our church through a QCD can benefit you, the taxpayer, by reducing your taxable income while you support our church and other charitable organizations. A QCD reduces taxable income

without requiring you to itemize deductions. Please consult with your financial advisor to see if this could benefit you. Any 2025 contribution must be post-marked no later than 12/31/25 or received by Bethel by December 31, 2025, to be included in the Bethel contributions for 2025.





Giving Report 2025 Bethel and Nationally 9/30/25

Through the generosity of many, it adds up to a lot! So what was accomplished through our gifts. \$2, 334, 289 was award to presbyteries and Presbyterian Disaster Assistance partners. Emphasis was placed on helping congregations and mid-councils protecting migrants. International grants supported work with Internally Displaced Persons in South Sudan and refugees from Ukraine.

National Response: Teams helped in 25 presbyteries. 75 grants were dispersed totaling \$879, 016. These gifts addressed immediate unmet needs as well as long-term recovery.

International Response: \$1,176,302 as disbursed to 18 countries, including Haiti, Malawi, Israel/Palestine, Ukraine, South Sudan, Pakistan, Nepal, Dominican Republic, and Democratic Republic of Congo. There are so many needs around the world.

Counter Stories Productions: Support for documentaries such as Evicting the American Dream, Trouble the Water, and additional work on documentaries on gun violence, industrial pollution and environmental racism.
